Our Graduate Degree Programs

Our full-time **Master of Laws (LL.M.) Program** integrates American and international law students at all levels of study. Through the LL.M. Program, international law graduates are able to gain knowledge of the U.S. legal system and develop an expertise in a particular area of law.

We also offer our **Summer Part-Time LL.M. in International Commercial Law** degree, which is designed especially for working legal professionals who wish to pursue a master's degree and specialized knowledge in all aspects of international commercial law. Participants attend courses for two to five consecutive summers.

Our 2016 Summer Programs

- **Orientation in U.S.A. Law** (July 10–August 6, 2016), a four-week overview of the U.S. legal system that includes optional LL.M. preparation
- **The Global Trading System** (August 7-20, 2016), a two-week specialized course for working legal professionals that includes international dispute resolution
- **Licensing Academy in Intellectual Property and Technology Transfer** (June 20–July 1, 2016), a two-week program detailing successful U.S. models of IP management; course includes a two-day license agreement writing workshop
- **International Comparative Environmental Law Seminar in Como, Italy** (May, 2016), a two-week program examining climate change law and policy, liability for environmental harm and more
